
# Earning carbon credits by implementing mitigation actions

# Context

The French Ministry for Ecological Transition has introduced the Low Carbon Label to encourage farmers to change their practices. To qualify for this certification, the assessment method must be certified by the Ministry. The method is called **Carbon Agri** and applied to mixed crop and livestock farms. The label concerns emission **reductions**. The tool used to evaluate is CAP'2ER (cf FS93)



# Please pay particular attention to these points

- Implementation advice Build a realistic, achievable action plan with the farmer.
- Carbon credits reward changes in practices implemented during the commitment period.



• Two eligibility criteria required: keeping permanent grassland, compliance with the 170 kg N/ha threshold

# **Cost and financing**

The 5-year support package costs around €2.000. Today, a number of programs (regional/dairy) make it possible to finance this to a large extent.

The farmer is paid €32/tonne CO2. On average, a farm reduces its emissions by 450 to 600 tonnes over 5 years.

### **Benefits**

- Compensation for practices implemented
- Post-payment, which means no risk of repayment
- Scope: mixed crop-livestock farm, carbon mitigation and/or sequestration practices.
